- BASED ON NEW LEGISLATION

 - COMMERCIAL CODE (non-profit company) - PPP
 - FOUNDATIONS LAW


TYPE 1 AGENCIES

- **Agricultural Property Agency** – to manage and privatise agricultural properties owned by state-run agricultural farms before the transformation,
- **Polish Agency for Enterprise Development** – to implement programmes of grants and loans for SMEs,
- **Agricultural Market Agency** – to stabilise prices on the agricultural market and to make intervention purchases,
- **Agriculture Restructuring and Modernisation Agency** – to carry out and finance modernisation activities in agriculture and in rural areas,
- **National Health Service** – to manage the public health service by contracting out health services,
- **National Fund for the Rehabilitation of Disabled Persons** – to finance activities addressed to disabled persons,
- **National Fund for Environmental Protection and Water Management** – to finance ecology-oriented projects through a system of grants and preferential loans,
- **Voivodship Funds for Environmental Protection and Water Management** – as above, but at the regional level.
- **EURO 2012 Agency** – to build the national stadium in Warsaw and to prepare EURO 2012 Football Championship.


TYPE 2 AGENCIES

- **Regional Development Agencies** – to support regional and local development in the preparation and implementation of investment projects and studies – **99% ESTABLISHED BY VOIVODES AND TRANSFERED TO REGIONAL GOVERNMENTS !!**
- **Polish Information and Foreign Investment Agency** – to promote Poland and attract FDI,
- **Industrial Development Agency** – to carry out restructuring and privatisation activities undertaken as government interventions in relation to specific state-owned enterprises, degraded areas and unwanted property
- **Polish-German Cooperation Foundation** – support projects.

RDA- areas of operation

CONSULTING ACTIVITY

- ✓ development strategies and restructuring programmes;
- ✓ feasibility studies, substitute investor services and function of contract engineer;
- ✓ trainings and conferences;
- ✓ studies on water management and flood protection.

REGIONAL FINANCING INSTITUTION

- ✓ implementation of national and EU support programmes for SMEs;
- ✓ consultations on grants available to SMEs;
- ✓ training on application for EU funds and grant settlement.

FOREIGN INVESTOR ASSISTANCE

- ✓ assistance in contacts with central and local administration;
- ✓ seeking locations for investments;
- ✓ preparation and comprehensive support of the investment process.

REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT

- ✓ Studies, initiatives, etc.;
- ✓ international projects, international cooperation;
- ✓ support for regional and local government

Relations agencies - voivode

- very diverse
- do not have the character of superior authority or supervision
- rather coordination
- much stronger powers in relation to agencies operating as government-run agencies based on the legislative regulatory framework
- little possibility of exerting a direct impact on agencies operating as foundations/companies

Evaluation of agencies

- assessed quite differently
- 1st type agencies have become similar to public administration offices.
- Effects of inspections of the Supreme Chamber of Control (NIK) have also contributed to that operate rather in order to minimise the risk of failure.
- agencies operating based on the commercial code or the law on foundations are much better
- eliminated the possibility of transferring mechanisms of operation of public administration offices to the management of these institutions.

Conclusion

- As a consequence of failures in the agencies of the first type, the government have undertaken the initiative to redefine the idea of the agency performing public tasks by providing for a new legal solution – the implementing agency – in the new bill on public finances.
- The legislative work is ongoing in the Parliament
- the new solutions will take effect at the earliest in 2009.
